Defense University Inaugurated Professor of Defense Science and Opened Doctoral Study Program

The Defense University (IDU) held an Open Session for the Opening of the Doctor of Defense Sciences and the Inauguration of a Professor of Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Prof. Dr. Marsetio, which was opened by Rector of Defense University Lieutenant General of Indonesia Armed Forces Dr. Yoedhi Swastanto, M.B.A. accompanied by Defense Minister of Republic of Indonesia General of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Ryamizard Ryacudu and Prof. Dr. Bunyamin Mahtuh, S.H from Ministry of Research, Technology, and Higher Education, located at AH. Nasution Building floor 16, Thursday (7/26).

Since its establishment in 2009, the Defense University has produced two defense science professors. The sixth President of the Republic of Indonesia, General of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Prof. DR. Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono became the first professor in 2014. Followed this year the former Indonesian Navy Chief of Staff, Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Prof. DR. Marsetio became a defense science professor.

Inauguration of Professor of Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Prof.

Dr. Marsetio and the Opening of the Doctoral Defense Sciences were carried out through the University Open Session, in that process the Minister of Defense handed over the IDU Doctoral Flag to the Rector of Defense University followed by the Pinning of IDU Badge by The Rector of Defense University to representatives of IDU students, and continued with Ministry of Research, Technology, and Higher Education Decision reading related to the Opening of IDU Doctoral Defense Sciences Program.



Still in the series of processions of the Defense University Open Session, Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Prof. Dr. Marsetio gave his scientific oration and continued with the Inauguration as Professor of Defense University by The Rector of Defense University as Chairman of the Academic Senate of Defense University.

The inauguration of the Professor further strengthened the roadmap of defense science development through various studies as well as the academic legality of the opening of the Doctoral Study Program at the same time. Both the inauguration of Professor and the opening of the

Doctoral Study Program are systematic achievements in order to realize IDU as a World Class Defense University in 2024.

The Defense Minister of the Republic of Indonesia expressed his appreciation and pride because IDU, on its relatively young age, had shown its existence as one of the fastest growing university. The opening of the Doctoral Defense Science Program is expected to further enhance the role and strategic functions of the Defense University.

The Defense Minister of the Republic of Indonesia added the role of IDU in the future is expected to contribute, not only at the national level but also at the international level. This contribution demands that IDU produce more professors in the future. Later IDU and its professors should be able to become a center of excellence for defense studies and defense technologies in the Industrial Revolution 4.0.

The Defense Minister of the Republic of Indonesia hopes that the graduates of the IDU Doctoral Program will become experts in the field of Defense who are professional and should be proud of. The IDU Doctoral Candidates can synergize with other scientific fields by not leaving the foundation of insight, character and national spirit.

To the newly inaugurated Professor of Defense University, The Defense Minister of the Republic of Indonesia hoped to spread positive energy for the progress of Defense University and the wider community in general. The Defense Minister of the Republic of Indonesia believes in Prof. Dr. Marsetio's



experience and expertise in the field of Maritime Biology will further strengthen IDU's capabilities and capacity towards the vision of "The World Class Defense University" in 2024.

According to the Rector of Defense University, the inauguration of Defense University professors further strengthened the roadmap of Defense Science development as well as academic legality for the opening of the Doctoral Study program of Defense University. This is a matter of pride and good performance in order to realize IDU as the World Class Defense University in 2024. Hopefully, with the opening of the Doctoral program and the inauguration of this professor, it will strengthen the existence and align IDU with other defense universities in the world,"

Scientific oration of The Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Prof. DR. Marsetio was entitled "Changing the Geo Maritime Order After the Establishment of USINDOPACOM and its Implications for the South China Sea Conflict in an Indonesian Perspective", in his speech, he discussed many maritime security theories in terms of cultural and technological approaches in accordance with the fields established by The Ministry of Research, Technology, and Higher Education, namely the defense science in Culture Maritime Technology.

It was stated that currently there was a struggle for hegemony in the Asia Pacific region, so I conducted a study and analysis of the impact of the increasing USPACOM authority which is now USINDOPACOM, with these changes, the duties, and responsibilities





of the United States Pacific Command (USPACOM) that had been in the Asia Pacific it expanded to the Middle East. "This means that Pacific Command has two fleets, namely the 5th Fleet and 7th Fleet. This will change the order of defense of the countries of the world. The United States is currently trying to maintain its hegemony in the Asia Pacific and does not want to compete with China. Xi Jin Ping with One Belt One Road and its claim to the South China Sea are considered by the President of the United States Donald Trump as an attempt to seize his hegemony, the movement of people, goods, and energy, has always relied heavily on sea transportation. While in the Malacca Strait there were 15 million barrels and 90,000 ships passed in these waters.

As a country whose position is very strategic because it is located between two continents and the Ocean, Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Prof. Dr. Marsetio said that Indonesia should increase its awareness of the maritime environment. "If the two main powers of China and America engage in an open conflict, politically it will put Indonesia in a difficult position".

After the Professors' inauguration procession was completed, continued by congratulations from the invited guests consisting of officials within the Ministry / Agency, Headquarters and Forces, National Police, among others Indonesia Navy Chief of Staff Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force Siwi Sukma Adji, SE, MM, Commander General of Indonesia Armed Force of Indonesia Military Academy, Rectors and officials from universities such as UI, IPB, UPN etc., as well as Echelon I and II officials of IDU and other invited guests.







Defense University Holds the 2nd International Defense Science Seminar (IIDSS) in 2018, July 11-12 in Jakarta

The Defense University once again held an International Indonesia International Defense Science Seminar (IIDSS) 2018, with the theme “Strengthening Defense Diplomacy to Address Common Security Challenges”, the second IIDSS seminar was held on July 11 and 12, 2018. The seminar was officially opened by the Coordinating Minister for Politics and Security, General (Ret.) Dr. Wiranto, S.H. accompanied by the Minister of Defense Indonesia Armed Force General (Ret.) Ryamizard Ryacudu and The Rector of IDU Lieutenant General of Indonesia Armed Force Dr. Yoedhi Swastanto, M.B.A, at Grand Mercure Kemayoran, Central Jakarta, Thursday (11/7).

The Rector of IDU Lieutenant General of Indonesia Armed Force Dr. Yoedhi Swastanto, M.B.A., said that the IIDSS is an international seminar held in order to overcome global security challenges viewed from the perspective of defense diplomacy, the IIDSS seminar is also expected to contribute to the development of defense science.

Dean of Defense Management Faculty of Defense University, Rear Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force Dr. Amarulla Octavian, ST., M, Sc., DESD as Chair of the IIDSS explained, this seminar aims to explore new thoughts from scientists, and on its implementation through the concentration on the global order as an alternative to a more just order



management to ensure global security and prosperity.

“There were 3 (three) targets for the this IIDSS seminar, Which are; academic success, successful achievement and successful implementation, focusing on achieving recognition of defense science as a discipline equivalent to other national and international knowledge groups at once, recognizing Defense University’s ability to organize international events. Have high standards, “explained the Rear Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force, Dr. Amarulla Octavian.

There were 24 speakers consisting of 14 experts from abroad, 3 from international organizations and 7 from Indonesia. There are 2 foreign speakers from the United States, 2 from Russia, 2 from Britain, 1 from Australia, 1 from India, 1 from Japan, 1 from China, 1 from Bulgaria, 1 from Bangladesh, 1 from the Philippines, 1 from Malaysia, 1 from the IAEA, 1 from ASEAN, and 1 from the IORA.

Global Diplomacy on Non-Proliferation of WMD, 2. Cracking Down Transnational Organized Crimes (TOC) in the ASEAN Region, and 3. Energy and Natural Resources: Promoting Sustainable Resources Development.

While the topic of the second-day seminar, Thursday 12 July 2018 were 1. Terrorism and Separatism Challenges, 2. Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief Sharing Best Practices and Strategies in Disaster Relief and, 3. Media and Information Warfare.

The results of the seminar will be summarized into a nationally accredited and/or internationally accredited Proceeding as input to the Government of Indonesia and contributions to the world community.

The Chairperson of the IIDSS explained that Defense Universities from other countries in attendance were from Australia, Japan, South Korea and New Zealand, from



While the moderators were 6 Defense University lecturers from various study programs from the Defense Strategy Faculty (FSP), the Defense Management Faculty (FMP), the National Security Faculty (FKN) and the Defense Technology Faculty (FTP). From the theme above, there are 6 topics in the seminar with the composition of the discussion, 12 from the Defense Studies perspective and 12 from the Defense Technologies perspective according to the basis of defense science development.

The topic of the seminar on the first day, Wednesday, July 11, 2018, were 1. Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD):

Thailand present as a Defense-affiliated university and from Vietnam came as an educational institution under the coordination of the Ministry of Defense of Vietnam (at the Indonesian National Resilience Institute) as well as from universities throughout Indonesia, a number of 24 universities include UI, ITB, IPB, UGM, and others.

The total number of participants in this international seminar was attended by more than 1,000 participants, consisting of representatives of all embassies and consulates of



other countries and international organizations based in Jakarta. The seminar was also attended by Defense Attaches of friendly countries, all ministries, and institutions related to defense aspects, Headquarters of Indonesia Armed Force, Third Headquarters of the Armed Forces and National Police Headquarters.

In addition, it was also attended by Indonesia military and police educational institutions, and educational institutions from several ministries, as well as several think tanks. The mass media also attended this international seminar, both domestic and foreign media consisting of print media, electronic media, and online media, including VOA, also enlivened by Strategic Industries of the State-Owned Enterprises (BUMNIS) which opened 5 booths to introduce BUMNIS to the participants who attended the seminar.

The Seminar on the second day featured

speakers including Executive Vice President of the Philippines, Brigadier General (Ret) Rolando G. Jungco, Rutgers University Camden, USA Prof. Paul A. Jargowsky, Ph.D., Deputy 3 of the International Cooperation Division of Indonesian National Counter-Terrorism Agency Inspector General Police. Drs. Hamidin and Major General of Indonesia Armed Force (ret) Djoko Setiadi, M.Si, thoroughly discussed the challenges of terrorism and separatism.

The second session was further discussion about ideas and strategies in dealing with disasters. This discussion was presented by resource persons who were competent in their fields, such as; Mr. Rafendi Djamin, Director of the Southeast Asia and Pacific region, Prof. Stephen Cameron from Oxford University, Prof. Josaphat Tetuko Sri Sumantyo from Chiba University, Japan, and Dr. Gatot Hari Gunawan.

Media and information warfare was

the closing theme of this 2018 IIDSS seminar. With the speaker as follows; Akhyari Hananto, Founder and Chief Editor of GNFI, Prof. Ahmad Ghazali Abu Hasan from the Department of Strategic Defense (Malaysian NDU), Mr. Yuliardi Sutedja K. from the Indonesia Cyber Security Forum.

On the sidelines of the seminar, a talk show was also broadcasted live by Radio Republik Indonesia (RRI) with the speaker, The Rector of IDU Lieutenant General of Indonesia Armed Force Dr. Yoedhi Swastanto, M.B.A, Deputy of Department III for International Cooperation of Indonesian National Counter-Terrorism Agency Inspector General of Police. Drs. Hamidin, Deputy Chairperson of the House of Representatives Commission I, Ir. H. Satya Widya Yudha, ME, M.Sc., Executive Vice President of NDC of the Philippines, Brigadier General (Ret.) Rolando G. Jungco and Member of Supervisory Board of the People





Republic of China, Freddy Ndolu. The talk show, which was broadcasted live, discussed related to counter-terrorism.

IIDSS 2018 closed with the presentation of the results of the seminar by the Dean of the Defense Management Faculty, Rear Admiral of Indonesia Armed Force Dr. Amarulla Octavian, S.T., M.Sc., DESD who also served as Chairperson of the committee in the implementation of 2018 IIDSS, he also expressed his gratitude to the speakers for their involvement in this academic forum. He also hopes, this forum can encourage to formulate solutions, inspiration, and ideas for policymakers to strengthen regional and global defense diplomacy.

The 2nd International Seminar on IIDSS was officially closed by The Rector of IDU Lieutenant General of Indonesia Armed Force Dr. Yoedhi Swastanto, M.B.A, and in his speech, The Rector of IDU said that this agenda was one of the functions of the academic

forum to answer global challenges. He also expressed his gratitude to all speakers, moderators and also to all 2018 IIDSS participants who have participated actively from government staff, policymakers, military, think tanks, and students who have contributed to this seminar. He also revealed that the success of 2018 IIDSS is inseparable from contributions and collaboration from electronic online media, national and international. At the end of his remarks, the Chancellor of Defense University invited all participants who were present to attend the third IIDSS in 2019.

After the second day of the IIDSS seminar, the seminar committee invited international speakers to visit TMII to introduce Indonesian cultural diversity, Friday (7/13).

Participants of the delegation included Prof. Marie Isabelle Chevrier from America, Alexey P from Russia, Prof.

Son Kyengho from Korea, Prof. Stephen Cameron and Dr Lijun Shang from the UK, and Ngo Xuan Truong from Vietnam were very enthusiastic about the opportunity to visit TMII to get a glimpse of Indonesian culture, on this occasion the speakers were invited to visit the South Sulawesi platform which was immediately greeted with a peace dance which was a combination of tribal dances in the area Sulawesi, then participants were introduced to the culture and architecture of the building from the South Sulawesi region.

Participants were invited to visit the Indonesian Museum Tourism platform, entering the first floor of the Indonesian TMII museum, the delegations were introduced about the diversity of 33 Provinces in Indonesia from Istiadat customs, about the Ramayana story, as well as various types of puppets displayed in a diorama and traditional musical instruments from various regions in Indonesia.

IDU's students also received a Public Lecture from Marshal of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret) Chappy Hakim, with the theme "Repositioning Air Defense Identification Zone (ADIZ)". Wednesday (16/5).



In his general lecture, Marshal of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Chappy Hakim explained the importance of the airspace zone in the context of the implementation of state sovereignty over the Republic of Indonesia airspace, which was stated in Article 6 of Law No.1 of 2009 concerning the implementation of state sovereignty over the Republic of Indonesia airspace. Authority and responsibility for regulating the air space for the benefit of aviation, national economy, defense and security, social affairs, and the air environment.

As an emphasis in the application of the Air Reposition of Defense Identification Zone (ADIZ) Marshal of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Chappy Hakim assessed that it was necessary to anticipate possible protests from other countries in terms of border areas such as the Natuna Islands,

Ambalat and around the Philippines, as far as possible the determination of coordinates The ADIZ is in accordance with the agreement that has been set. If the coordinates have not been agreed, then it is determined based on the position of Indonesia, then the ADIZ Procedure applies if the flight of the foreign aircraft enters the ADIZ area and leads to Indonesia airspace.

Judging from the aspect of the procedure, law enforcement must be clear between National Air.

Defense Command and Airnav of Indonesia in terms of communication and command and control over violating aircraft and the importance of clear information in AIP that this ADIZ is not an expansion of national territory but an early warning space.

IDU's students also received a public lecture delivered by the Minister of Communication and Information of the Republic of Indonesia Rudiantara S.Stat. M.B.A., represented by the Expert Staff of the Minister of Technology Ir. Herry Abdul Azis, M.Eng. With the theme "Improving the Role of Communities in Cyber Security". Wednesday, (30/5).

Based on data from January 1st to September 18, 2017, the total complaints from the public and agencies regarding negative content reached 42,821 complaints. Where the first position was occupied by complaints about racial / hate (13,829), then followed by pornography complaints (13,120), and hoaxes (6,973 complaints). Information Technology's Expert Staff in Technology provides an overview of the condition of the cyberspace situation in Indonesia from the APJII survey results in 2017, of Indonesia's total population of 262 million Million, for Internet users reaching 143.26 million people, or 54.68% of the total population in Indonesia., While the composition of users is based on age, the age range of 19-34 years is the main contributor with a percentage of 49.52%, 35-54 years (29.55%), 13-18 years (16.68%), and more from 54 years (4.24%). Viewed by gender, men (51.43%) dominated women (48.57%). Using smartphone media, it reached 44.16%.

of cyber security which includes two elements, namely internal elements (Society) in the internet should use original software, backup data and use antivirus in the device, while external elements that include government agencies, media , CERT / CSIRT, Industry or operators, communities or public associations as well as professionals so as to always cooperate in increasing public awareness, especially in terms of cyber security awareness, and to better socialize how good social media use or positive or healthy internet.

The development of internet users is increasingly widespread, inviting the occurrence of crime or crime in cyberspace or cyber world (Cyber Crime) from the data of APJII 2017 survey results, that respondents are aware of the data can be taken (65.98%) and aware of fraud on the internet (83.98%).

Judging from the map of cyber threats in Indonesia, the threat is increasing from the ID-SIRTII record in 2014, there are 48.8 million cyber-attacks in Indonesia. The attacks were mostly caused by the "malware" activity of 12,007,808 incidents. The attack was caused by a security gap of 24,168 cases, track record leakage or "leakage record" 5,970 cases. There are also attacks through "password harvesting" or "phishing" as many as 1,730 cases and attacks due to domain leakage as many as 215 cases. From this figure, according to ID-SIRTII, the government page or go.id address is the most attacked by hackers.



The IDU's student general lecture was also given by the Presidential Chief of Staff of Republic of Indonesia General of Indonesia Armed Force (Ret.) Dr. Moeldoko, with the theme "Infrastructure Development in Border Areas through Security and Prosperity Approaches", Monday (6/25).

Starting the lecture, in general the President's Chief of

Staff asked IDU's students to respond to the development of the global strategic environment should not be linear, but thought patterns were more developed in a leap with emphasis on speed, and each individual had contributions in the form of thought and action to the state.

Furthermore, it was stated that IDU as a Higher Education Institution that creates potential leaders who have intellectual capital, of course, this is related to strategic defense in which the defense sector is not free from the influence of other aspects, such as Industry, Economy, Trade, and others. Responding to the current development of the 4.0 Industrial Revolution, Indonesia needs to develop the skills needed to face the Industrial Revolution 4.0, namely the need for increasingly complex problem-solving skills, thinking in risky situations or critical thinking, creative and innovative.

The current aspects of Indonesia's development include Infrastructure Development in the context of connectivity development that has physical and non-physical values where physical development influences the externalist aspects which affect financially, and for non-physical development more to the development of human civilization, building the spirit of Indonesia so that they feel that part of Indonesia is the highest value for regions in the border, so that close connectivity between central and remote areas and border blood is established. In addition, the connectivity will also foster new cultural acculturation between regions in Indonesia.

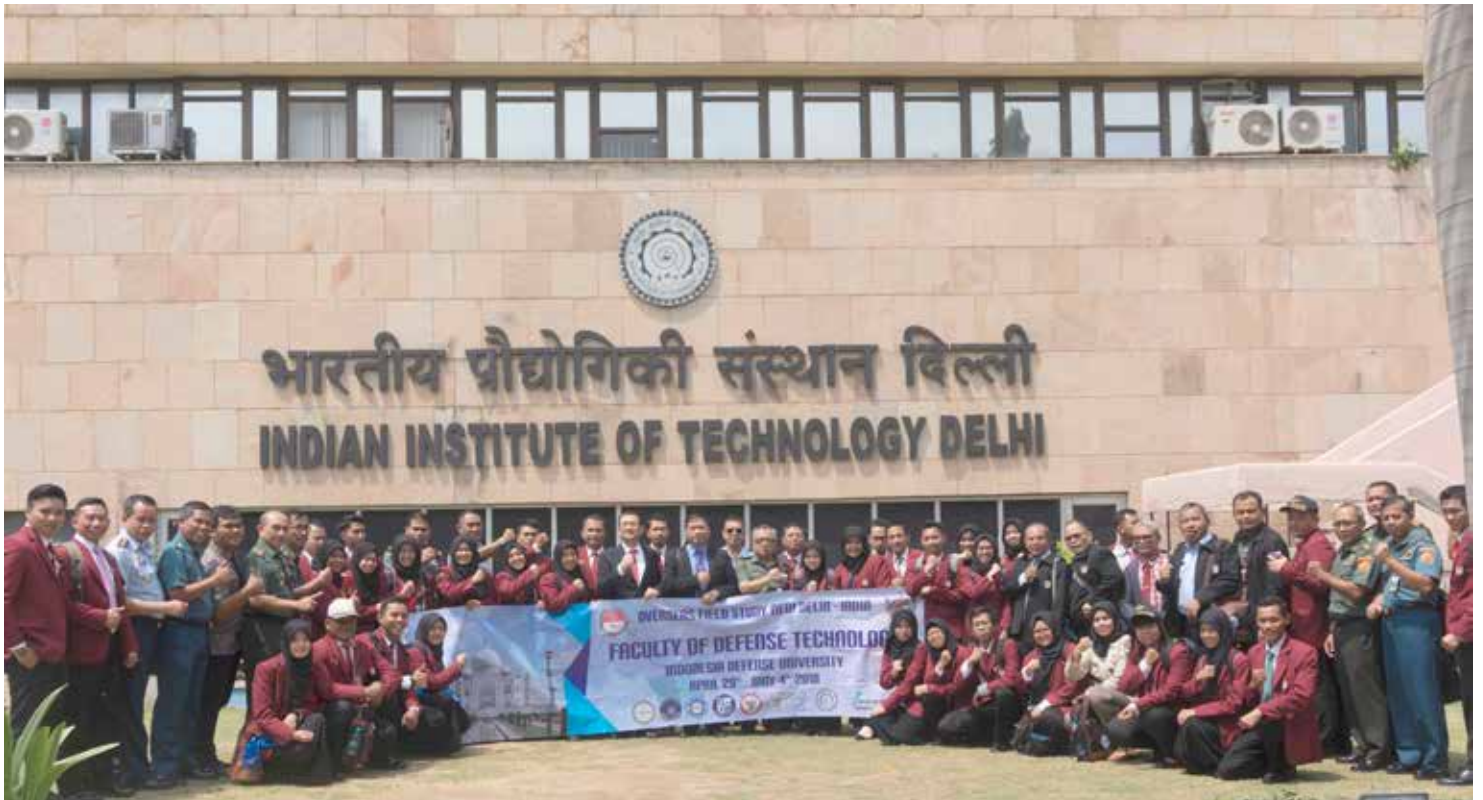

What is taken from Japanese learning is a policy strategy for handling natural disasters, disaster countermeasure basic act, while learning from India about “Ahimsa” which has an important role in fostering a spirit of peace and managing differences in India, which was initiated by Mahatma Gandhi, and learning from South Korea is how South Korea played an important role in the development of the Yellow Sea and East China Sea disputes.

It was informed that South Korea-China was a claimant state and several times involved in open disputes, both of them were parties with high intensity of disputes but in terms of relations, both were very close, especially in the economic field.

The main program of the seminar was the presentation of representatives of the Disaster Management Study Program by raising the topic “Living Harmony with Disaster Risk”, and the next presentation was the representative of Peace and Conflict Resolution study program on Ahimsa Paradox in Safeguarding Peace in India. Maritime For South Korean Maritime Border Empowerment-Learning for Indonesia “.

Defense Strategy Faculty of IDU held a Seminar on the Results of Overseas Study Research in Australia and China, by raising the topic “State Security Strategy and Australia’s Asymmetric Threats and Chinese Defense Diplomacy in the perspective of Indonesia’s National Defense System”, Wednesday (May 16).

As the keynote speaker was the Dean of Defense Strategy Faculty Major General of Indonesia Armed Forces Dr. Tri Legionosuko, S.IP., M.AP, and other speakers such as Major General of Indonesia Armed Forces (Ret) Dr. Ir. Syaiful Anwar M.Bus., MA., Then from LIPI, an expert who is an expert

in International Political Study Riefqi Muna, M.A., Ph.D and an expert in anthropology and political researcher Aris Arif Mundayat Ph.D.

Overseas Study research of Defense Strategy Faculty was carried out in three waves, Australia’s research was carried out by the Total War Strategy Study Program (SPS) on the 11th until March 17, 2018, and Asymmetric Warfare Study Program (AW) dated April 28, d. Australia has a system of national security that is continuous and made in 20 years, to formulate national security policies implemented by integrated agencies so as to facilitate and speed up decision making.

of cyberspace change as one of the threats that the world needs to face in this case the Australian government believes that Cyber incidents that occur have an impact on infrastructure and service disruptions that cause losses and have an impact on national security.

Entering the third session of the Defense Strategy Faculty seminar was continued with a presentation from the Defense Diplomacy Study Program (DP) represented by Sarah Astried with the focus of the discussion on Defense Diplomacy of the People's Republic of China in carrying out the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) associated with the Indonesian defense system.

The seminar presented Keynote speech Dean of the Faculty of Defense Management, Rear Admiral of Indonesia Armed Forces Dr. Amarulla Oktavian, ST, M.Sc., DESD along with other speakers from IDU Lecturers Major General of Indonesia Armed Forces (Ret) Makmur Supriyatno, B.Sc, S.Pd., M.Pd., Aries Arif Mundayat, Ph.D., and Henry Wiratama (PT. Huawei Indonesia), guided by moderator Dr. Ir. Rudy Laksmono W, M.T.

The overseas study research seminar was opened directly by the Rector of IDU, Lieutenant General of Indonesia Armed Forces Dr. Yoedhi Swastanto, MBA, in his speech stated that the seminar on the results of the research aims to increase knowledge and experience on the global development of Economics, Industry, and resources in China, so that it can reflect the results of these studies for development in Indonesia, as well as input for relevant stakeholders for decision making furthermore, further the Rector of

The keynote speech delivered by the Dean of Defense Management Faculty, Rear Admiral of Indonesia Armed Forces Dr. Amarulla Oktavian, S.T., M.Sc., D.E.S.D explained that China is one of the most important countries in the world now. As a rising force, China will continue to be one of the decisive forces of the 21st century. The impact of China's rise has shown in various countries and triggered the development of the Western world. One such impact is the formation of BRI which supports the Chinese economy.

Belt and Road initiative (BRI) is an initiative proposed by the Chinese government, initially focusing on connectivity and cooperation between Eurasian countries. BRI consists of three parts: landline Silk Road Economic Belt (SREB), Sea Silk Road (MSR) and a newly established Digital Silk Road (DSR). The focus of investment in several sectors, including infrastructure, education, construction materials, railways and roads, cars, real estate, electricity networks, iron and steel.

The use of renewable energy in China has grown rapidly during the period 2003-2011. In the new energy sector, China has long used nuclear as an alternative energy source in their efforts to meet energy needs. Panda's power plant initiative was also incorporated into the "Belt and Road" initiative,

China's ambitious plan to invest in development projects along the Silk Road for solar, wind, biomass and geothermal power. We can learn from China through optimizing the government's commitment to mapping



the activities of the overseas study Program in China from May 7 to 11 2018, which was attended by 113 IDU students, consisting of Energy Security Study Program (KE) Defense Management Study Program (MP) and

IDU said that this seminar could be used as a discuss forum and study that built the space for academic dialectics based on a systematic, solid, comprehensive and integral formulation, a sharp problem analysis,



and generating plans for energy sources based on regional potential.

The main program of the seminar was the presentation of representatives of the Defense Management Study Program presented by Afni Tri Septiani raising the topic "Learning from national security defense, defense management, bilateral cooperation between Indonesia and China", and the next presentation of representatives of Defense Economics Study Program Students Eggy Arman Ramdhani about "BRI and Defense Economy of the People's Republic of China" then the next speaker from Energy Security Study Program Rani Agus Triani with the theme "Comparison of China's new and renewable energy management for Indonesian energy security".

After the presentation, continued with responses and material studies by the resource person, followed by questions and answers and discussions between the speakers and the speakers. In this study, IDU Lecturer Aries Arif Mundayat, Ph.D., observed the role of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) concept adopted by China by utilizing Silk Road for the future of the Chinese Economy, as well as the role of economic geography.

developing technology and domestic defense industry, needs to cooperate with other countries, especially with developed countries. One form of defense industry cooperation is a joint development program which is a collaboration between government and multinational companies involved in the development and production of weapons systems, including evaluation, costs, and distribution of profits on the sale of weapons production.

We cannot deny that the process of globalization has an impact on the interdependence of interests in various fields, including in the defense and technology industries. A developed country is able to provide a technology transfer mechanism to countries that are less developed in technical responsibilities, for example to obtain production efficiency.

In the framework of defense

cooperation with other countries, the Indonesian government has always been interested in following this technology transfer clause in the development of defense equipment. The industry defends this challenge to implement and make arrangements based on the standards provided. This development must be seen as a special spirit for the Indonesian government

to obtain self-sufficiency. Finally, this Seminar will be a great platform for us to rethink our own defense technology and industry.

National Security Faculty Maritime Security Study Program of Indonesia Defense University held a Focus Discussion Group (FGD) with the theme “Management of Maritime Potential in Sebatik Border Areas with Malaysia” at the Multipurpose Hall of IDU, Sentul-Bogor. (7/8)

Dean of the National Security Faculty, Rear Admiral of Indonesia Armed Forces Dr. Siswo Hadi Sumantri, ST, MT in his remarks during the opening of the FGD said that this academic forum was needed in order to criticize and provide theoretical and scientific suggestions. In addition, the management of border areas is an issue related to the strategic environment.

In the FGD, as the first Speaker of the Nunukan Asmin Regent, Laura Hafid explained the “Role of Local Governments in Increasing the Potential of Border Areas for Community Welfare”. Regional border management is an endless work as

long as this country stands. This is on the basis that the region is one of the elements of the existence of a country, besides the people, the government, and the ability to interact with the international community and the recognition of other countries.

Therefore, it is only natural that Regional Governments, especially those with

border areas, need an integrated and sustainable management mechanism because there will always be “friction” or interaction with neighboring countries, both positive and negative. The border region, both on land and at sea, has a very important and strategic role in a country. This is due to the border area other than being a sovereignty boundary, also an area



that reflects the front page of a country. As the next speaker, Agus Purwoto, Secretary of Maritime Affairs, delivered his presentation stating that as the largest archipelagic country, Indonesia has the busiest trade route, where every year around 58% of world trade passes through the Gulf of Malacca, Sunda, and Lombok with a total trade value of USD 435 billion.

Indonesia also has the largest mangrove and Seagrass area in the world, which is an important element in Blue Carbon Management, which serves to reduce carbon dioxide and other effects of the effects of atmospheric greenhouse gases and help reduce the impact of climate change.

Another important thing discussed is the impact of marine waste on Indonesia, among others, on the world of tourism, the environment, and underwater life and human health where more than a third of fish samples that are traded have been found to consume plastic or micro/nano plastic.

To overcome this sea waste, the Government is targeting the reduction of plastic waste in the sea which is implemented in an integrated manner through programs in 16 Ministry of Agriculture and Institutions with behavioral change strategies, reducing land leakage, reducing leakage from the sea, improving law and funding and research and development.

The next FGD was conducted by the Disaster Management Study Program which organized Focus Group Discussion on Climate Change Disaster Management and Adaptation in the Framework of the National Defense System, (2/8).

The FGD was attended by students of the Disaster Management Study Program, followed by IDU lecturers, practitioners, and alumni, and was opened by the Dean of the National Security Faculty, Rear Admiral of Indonesia Armed Forces Dr. Siswo

Hadi Sumantri, ST, M.MT.

The Dean of the National Security Faculty said that this academic forum was needed in order to criticize and provide theoretical and scientific suggestions. Besides that climate



change is an issue related to the strategic environment.

As a guest speaker, First Marshall of Indonesia Armed Forces Dr. Danardono Sulistyono Adji, M.PP. from the Director of Defense Technology and Industry the Directorate General of Defense Potential of the Ministry of Defense delivered his presentation stating that due to climate change, a country will have the opportunity to strengthen independent technology and industry. This will also increase defense forces in supporting national safety.

Today's global issues related to the mastery of energy and food resources. This will be a challenge if it is associated with the increasing phenomenon of demographic change. The use of energy sources will shift from fossil energy to bio-energy so that its fulfillment will overlap with food needs.

Although Indonesia has the abundant potential for energy and food sources,

unwise management will provide problems. This could also be a potential conflict that not only affects the economic and infrastructure sectors but also affects the national and international military aspects. Other resource persons in the FGD

this time were Dr. Ari Mochammad Advisor, for USAID's Climate Change Governance Sector, said that future wars no longer use conventional strategies but rather provide out-of-date technology that has environmental impacts, health problems, and climate change, so that infrastructure is forgotten to fulfill people's living needs.

The impact of climate change does not only threaten the economic and environmental sectors but poses a threat to the development sector. Because talking about the environment is a matter of long-term investment, not enough investment for only 5 years.

In the context of the future paradigm, the problem of climate change is no longer a matter of judging who is wrong but realizing that humans live in one region, one world.

REDD + is one of the supporting efforts to reduce the impact of climate change with an incentive mechanism for developing countries. This REDD + scheme is considered to be a failed

project in Indonesia because its implementation has not been integrated across sectors.

Mitigation of climate change adaptation is an effort of human intervention by reducing greenhouse gases. This adaptation of natural and human adaptation will create opportunities such as the development of technological innovation. Therefore, addressing climate change requires multidisciplinary integration of science. If policies and technology still cannot reduce the impact of significant disasters and climate change, then social capital becomes the front line capable of reducing disaster risk. Unfortunately, the program to support the development of community capacity is still small in the scope of the state budget because the results are deemed invisible in a short period of time.

Center for Peace and Conflict Resolution Study (PSDRK) Peace and Conflict Resolution Study Program, National Security Faculty, Defense University also organized Focus Group Discussion (FGD) with the theme “Resolution of Papua Conflict in the Defense and Security Perspective” at the Multipurpose Building of Defense University Auditorium on Friday, 27 July 2018.

This FGD activity was opened by the Dean of the National Security Faculty, represented by Secretary of Peace and Conflict Resolution study Program, Colonel Inf. Bambang Wahyudi, M.M., M.Sc. In his opening speech, Secretary of Peace and Conflict Resolution study program represented the dean of national Security Faculty said, the threat of national disintegration through political and armed movements which threatened the territorial integrity of the Republic of Indonesia unitary state, especially those that occurred in Papua had not been fully overcome. the establishment of special autonomy laws (laws) for the provinces of Papua and West Papua is one of the concrete and constitutional efforts to resolve community dissatisfaction with regard to welfare, justice, and honor in the region so that it will encourage a just and dignified settlement.

The threat of national disintegration through political and armed movements that threaten the territorial integrity of the unitary state of the Republic of Indonesia, especially those that occur in Papua have not been fully overcome. the establishment of special autonomy legislation for the provinces of Papua and West Papua is one of the concrete and constitutional efforts to resolve community dissatisfaction with regard to welfare, justice, and honor in the region so that it will encourage a just and dignified settlement.

Security approach taken by the government against the Papua conflict is to place security forces, namely the national and national police to maintain security in the Papua region, which is called military operations other than war (OMSP).





The implementation of the OMSP tasks is required to be based on the policies and political decisions of the state determined by the president/head of government. With this policy or regulation, it can legally perform the task of OMSP and the government can allocate a budget for its implementation.

Through the Focus Group Discussion (FGD) activities organized by the Center for Peace Studies and Conflict Resolution (PSDRK) National Security Faculty, hopefully students were able to share and get input to add insight, related to the theme of the activities raised, namely “Resolution of Papua Conflict in Defense and Security Perspective “.

The FGD was attended by 50 participants, consisting of the Management of the Study Center, students, Lecturers, and the IDU Academic Community. This activity was opened by the Dean of the National Security Faculty, represented by Secretary of Peace and Conflict Resolution study program, Colonel Inf. Bambang Wahyudi, M.M., M.Sc.

The speakers at this FGD were Inspector General Pol (Ret.) Dr. Bambang Suparno, SH, M.Hum and Major General of Indonesia Armed Forces (Ret.) Dr. (Cand) Puguh Santoso. In his presentation, the speaker explained that the right resolution and development needed to deal with the conflict in Papua, given that the conflict in the region had been going on for a long time. It aims to create a Peace Building in Papua.
